



VACANCY FOR THE POST OF DRIVERS FOR CLEEN FOUNDATION REGIONAL OFFICES IN LAGOS AND IMO STATES

The CLEEN Foundation (formerly known as Centre for Law Enforcement Education) is a non-governmental organization established in January 1998 with the mission of promoting public safety, security, and accessible justice through empirical research, legislative advocacy, demonstration programs and publications, in partnership with government and civil society.

Applications are invited from suitably qualified persons to be recruited as drivers to work out of the CLEEN Foundation regional offices in Lagos and Imo states under her Monitoring of Forfeited Assets Project.

Location: Lagos and Imo States

Type of Contract: Long-term (July 2021-June 2022)

Background

On 10 February 2021, the Federal Government of Nigeria through the Federal Ministry of Justice awarded CLEEN Foundation a contract to monitor, on behalf of the Nigerian citizens, the application of recovered funds (aka the “Abacha Loot”) to key sections of three civil construction projects: the Lagos-Ibadan Expressway, the Second Niger Bridge and the Abuja-Kano Expressway (the Projects) with the NSIA as the funding agency. The two Contractors responsible for these projects are RCC and JBN.

According to Schedule 4 of the PIDF priority projects and the updated program of works submitted by the Contractors commencing from June 2021, the Projects span eight (8) states namely Lagos, Oyo, Ogun, Delta, Anambra, FCT (Abuja), Kaduna and Kano. The total value of the three Projects amounts to N673.3 billion of which funding of N115.39 billion from the recovered assets will be disbursed cumulatively across the three project locations from June 2021 to March 2022. While both RCC and JBN were contracted to work on both sections of the Lagos to Ibadan Expressway, JBN was contracted to work on the Abuja to Kano Road and Second Niger Bridge. From the recovered funds of N115.39 billion:

- N37.96 billion will be channelled to construction works at the Lagos-Ibadan expressway;
- N38.73 billion for the second Niger bridge; and
- N38.71 billion for the Abuja-Kano Road.

To ensure effective discharge of its assignment, CLEEN assembled a team of experts to provide observatory and analytical procedures targeted at understanding:

- 1) The Projects' compliance with anti-corruption, anti-human trafficking, and other relevant compliance laws.
- 2) The Projects' plans vs. work in progress as well as quality control, health and safety and value engineering and cost control models used by the Contractors.
- 3) Spend categories and flow of funds to ensure they are in line with the agreed Disbursement Plan.
- 4) Procurement practices and internal controls over disbursement

To ensure effective monitoring of the project across the designated project sites, CLEEN Foundation has procured project vehicles for each of the three project sites for which qualified drivers are needed.

Requirements

Applicants must possess the following:

- Must be 21 years or older.
- Minimum of SSCE, OND/HND qualification.
- Valid Driver's Licence with minimum of 5 years relevant experience.
- Must have a clean driving record
- Must live in Lagos/Imo states.
- Conversant with roads in Lagos/Imo states and traffic laws
- Must be able to speak fluent English language
- Understanding the local language of the area covered (added advantage)

Application Deadline:

This EOI is open for qualified applicants from Monday 26th July to Friday 06 August, 2021.
