



SECOND NIGER BRIDGE COMMISSIONING



he outgoing administration, led by President Muhammadu Buhari on the 23rd of May officially commissioned the 2nd Niger bridge, Lokoja-Oweto Bridge in Nasarawa/Benue States, Ikom Bridge in Cross River State, Abuja-Kaduna-Kano Road, Federal Secretariat in Gusau, Awka, Yenogoa in Zamfara, Anambra and Bayelsa States respectively. CLEEN Foundation since February 2021 has monitored the utilization of certain recovered assets (Abacha loot III) as complimentary funds at the 2nd Niger Bridge, Abuja-Kano Road and the Lagos-Ibadan Expressway. As an organization, we are proud to be part of the process that led to the completion of these remarkable projects.

THREE DAY WORKSHOP FOR CITIZENS REPORTERS ON EARLY WARNING AND EARLY RESPONSE STRATEGIES IN KANO STATE

LEEN Foundation believes the power of grassroots engagement and community involvement in promoting safety, resilience, and rapid response to emerging challenges. This informed the intervention in Kano towards increasing civilian security in Highrisk areas of Nigeria's Northwest and Middle Belt regions, reducing enabling environments for intercommunal violence and public unrest, CLEEN Foundation in collaboration with Equal Access International is held a three-day workshop for citizens' reporters on Early Warning and Early Response Strategies in Kano State. It was a joint workshop of EWER Forum stakeholders from Kano and Kaduna state.

Citizens reporting largely promote early warning and early response as critical components of disaster management and conflict prevention. The module covers detecting potential threats and taking prompt action, mitigate the impact of disasters, reduce risks, and protect lives and livelihoods. The use of local knowledge, observations, and experiences were emphasized as invaluable in this process.


